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Director's Note

Welcome to The Aerospace Players' production of *The Sound of Music*. After more than two years of COVID-induced starts and stops, we are delighted to finally present to you the culmination of three months' hard work by a group of around 100 people. We are indebted to the City of Torrance and the James Armstrong Theatre staff for their support and hard work in making this possible.

In the midst of political turmoil, and on the verge of economic collapse induced by the Great Depression, a real-life story developed about a novice from the Benedictine Abbey of Nonnberg in Salzburg. Maria Kutschera, struggling some with the rules and discipline of the Abbey, became a temporary tutor for the family of a widowed, decorated submarine commander of the Austrian navy, a national hero. She fell in love with the family, married Georg von Trapp, and helped establish the family as a singing family phenomenon that won the Salzburg Music Festival in 1936. When the Nazis annexed Austria in 1938, the von Trapps first resisted and then fled – declining multiple enticements to stay – first to Italy, then to London and ultimately America.

This fascinating real-life story is *not quite* the story presented here in *The Sound of Music*, but the show is certainly based on this story as presented in Maria von Trapp's 1949 memoir *The Story of the Trapp Family Singers*, with many interesting details retained. I encourage you read this published and readily available memoir in Maria's own voice.

The resulting musical that we present to you today debuted just a decade later in 1959, and was an immediate success on Broadway, winning five Tony Awards. The 1965 film, starring Julie Andrews and Christopher Plummer, garnered five Academy Awards and is usually considered one of the most popular musical films ever.

I want to express my deep gratitude and respect for the cast, orchestra, and production staff of *The Sound of Music*, and their families as well, for all the necessary sacrifices. I am very grateful to our primary sponsors, the Aerospace Employees Association and The Aerospace Corporation. And I want to thank you, our audience (and today, our captive "performers" – please check out your "role" today on our inside back cover); we have been able to produce quality productions for 34 years now only with your terrific and loyal support.

And now, please sit back and relax – it's time for the show! We certainly hope you enjoy today's performance. Oh – and don't forget to turn off those cell phones and pagers – you definitely don't want to *get caught* "ringing" or "lighting up"!

What is Edelweiss, and why are we singing about it?

Edelweiss, a "noble" (edel) "white" (weiß) mountain flower in the daisy family, naturally grows in the high alps of Austria, Switzerland, and less so in Italy, France, and some Balkan countries. It is considered a national symbol in Austria and Switzerland. In "The Sound of Music", the song is considered a cultural anthem, somewhat akin to "America the Beautiful" in the USA; this is fictional – the song was written by Rodgers and Hammerstein for this show in 1959, the last song Hammerstein ever wrote. The song evokes popular myths of the period, and young suitors would climb the Alps collecting the flowers to prove their love to their sweethearts.
